ASM Overall Expectations

In order to create this environment, it takes love, grace, and all of us working together to achieve a common goal. With these goals in mind, the following expectations have been developed in order to guide our actions as we participate in ASM. Please read AS A FAMILY and sign.

Love One Another.

This one seems straight forward, but just in case, here is the expectation for how we treat each other.

• We will strive to be positive and encouraging to each other in how we speak at all times.

- •We will refrain from sarcasm and derogatory remarks. Just because we think our sarcasm or remarks are harmless or jokes does not mean the other person does.

General Expectations

•We will not bring tobacco, vapes, drugs (prescription or otherwise), alcohol, or any illegal substance to any ASM gathering. We will also not attend the event under the influence of any illegal substances.

• We will strive to honor God in all of our actions in order to create a positive, uplifting environment.

Trip Expectations

All other expectations will apply to trips, but there are some specific actions we should take in order to make our trips beneficial for all involved. As stated in the Event Permission Form, parents are

responsible for the costs if the student is sent home from a trip for their conduct.

- •We will strive to have great, selfless attitudes! This will make the trip more fun for everyone!
- •We will read the trip itinerary and packing lists and prepare accordingly for each trip.
- •We will give all prescriptions to the YM or the adult sponsor in charge of them.
- •We will respect the scheduled times and be responsible for knowing those times.
- •We will sign-up by the deadline in order to help with the planning of the trip.
- •We will always be in the presence of an adult leader.
- •We will not leave the church after a trip until the vehicles are cleared and clean.
